I chose Sing we now of Christmas and Ding Dong Merrily on High for our songs to look at during January. I hope that you like reading about the history behind these hymns.

Sing We Now of Christmas is a traditional French carol with origins unknown. It has 5 stanzas that tell of the angels announcing the birth, the shepherds visit, and the wisemen who come and worship. It's the perfect song to accompany the creche. The handmade nativity scene figures are not just in people's homes but also set up in the town square. Ding Dong Merrily on High was written in 1588. It was a French tune that was written sideways and it was found in the Orchesographic book. This book contains a lot of tunes from the French Renaissance period with instructions on how to dance the tunes. It has the title of Brandle D'LeOfficial. In 1948, Mary Stewart Evans translated the book to English. George Ratcliffe Woodward (1848-1914) wrote some lyrics and set the tune and the song became Ding Dong, Merrily on High. In 1924 it was published in The Cambridge Carol Book.
