### **TIS THE SEASON!**

I'm excited we are in the book of John for advent since it is the third Christmas story and the lesser celebrated. The Matthew Christmas story was written for an audience of Jews so it focused on pointing to Jesus as their Old Testament messiah and king. Matthew used genealogy to show the lineage of Jesus to Abraham and to the royal kingship of David. The Luke Christmas story was written for an audience of gentiles showing Jesus from a human perspective using the genealogy through Mary's father back to Adam. This gave the understanding that Jesus is for all people not just for Abrahamic descendants. Matthew uniquely shares the story of the magi and Luke tells of Gabriel's visit to Mary and Joseph. Luke also spends time laying out scenery of the birth in a relatable humanistic way with Bethlehem, the manger, angels, and shepherds.

Instead of focusing on the Earthly birth of Jesus, John takes the reader up to a heavenly view all the way back to creation. John's Christmas story uniquely leads us to understand the divinity of Jesus. John 1:1: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Jesus is the Word of God incarnate and the light and life of the world. John 1:14 "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory... full of Grace and Truth." In John, we look back to creation to know God and we look back to the Christmas story to know Jesus, the Word made flesh.

But during advent we look forward in hopeful anticipation. We look forward to Christmas celebrations with our family, buying special gifts for those we love, and songs to bring joy to the world. As Christians, Christmas is a reminder to celebrate the kingdom of God in the here and now and to look forward in faithful anticipation of the kingdom come.

As we approach this season with eyes of faith and the Holy Spirit, we should remember to look forward to the coming of Christ! We anticipate Jesus coming in the physical nativity. We anticipate Jesus coming into the heart of the believer. And we anticipate Jesus' second coming. Let us prepare for the coming of Christ all year not just in advent claiming it in our hearts, living it out in the world, and sharing it with others - proclaiming continuously the good news of Jesus Christ — His suffering, death, and resurrection.

The significance of this season to us as Christians is that it marks the Christian new year. Our liturgical (worship) calendar begins with Advent, the four weeks of preparation for Christ's birth. Christmas is a time for us to recall the Nativity and Jesus' manifestation for all the peoples of the world. Also significant is Christmas gift giving which of course isn't about the material things, it is the symbolic meaning of the gift giving. The ultimate gift. God's love. As you give gifts this season, consider giving that message as well, say such things as "Receive this gift from me as a reminder of the ultimate gift, the Love of God". Or even consider placing John 3:16 on the tag: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life". Or Isaiah 9:6, "For unto us a child is born, to us a son is given".

I wish you a very Merry Christmas and "May the God of Hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" Romans 15:13.

One of the things which makes a song so meaningful is the story of how the song was written and how it has journeyed through history. Each month we will be highlighting some of the songs we will be using in worship services.

<u>O Little Town of Bethlehem</u> was written by Phillip Brooks, an Episcopal priest who was ordained in 1859. He served as rector for Church of the Advent before moving on to Holy Trinity in 1862. He was a dynamic preacher in his twenties and rose to prominence preaching against slavery during the Civil War. He extended his ministry to African American troops in nearby training camps, advocated rights for freedman, and became active in the Union League. Phillip made a pilgrimage to Bethlehem after the Civil War. On Christmas Eve 1865, he wrote to the children of his Sunday



School parish how much the hymn singing reminded him of his home congregation. Three years after his visit to the Holy Land, he penned the lyrics to "O Little Town of Bethlehem". The church organist, Lewis Redner, set them to a tune he had previously composed called St. Louis.

"if anyone on earth knew that Jesus was virgin born—Mary knew". Mark spent the next seven years tweaking his lyrics and pondered what he would've asked Mary if he had met her. In 1991, Mark asked Buddy Green to write the music to his lyrics. Buddy thought about what the music should be, for two weeks, after that the music flowed out in a mere thirty minutes. The parole inside the migrant's room inspires the migrant workers that someday they will celebrate Christmas together with their families back home. It implies a messianic prophecy telling the workers about experiencing real hope of rescuing them from exploitations and oppressions.
