WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT JESUS?


As you read this I want to invite you to grab a piece of paper and a pen. I want to ask a question and take some time to write down everything that comes to your mind. Here's the question: How would you describe Jesus to your friend?

I think this question is one of the most simple but yet unasked questions of our faith. One of the core understandings of our faith is that because of the cross we have a "relationship" with Jesus, a relationship that is not a "he's my colleague" type, but rather one that surpasses any level of intimacy we could ever achieve with someone. Why? Because Jesus' passion for us is rooted in the fact that He loves us so much, a love, as the Greek would say, "agape" (unconditional love).

Jesus' love for us is so deep that Jesus knows every single thing about us. He knows what makes us happy, what makes us sad, what makes us angry and what gives us peace. He knows us so much that quite frankly He knows us more than we know ourselves. But let's flip it. How much do we know about Jesus? And I'm not just talking about knowing Jesus who died on the cross and rose from the dead. Let's ask deeper. I'm asking, what do you know about Jesus about one who you are in a relationship with? What does Jesus like? What makes Him sad, angry, happy, surprised?

Scripture reveals to us that Jesus was fully divine and fully human, full of emotions and character. Jesus isn't some high being who is emotionless and stagnant. Jesus is an active being who desires to pursue deep intimacy with us, whom He loves. If He knows us so well then let me ask again: What do you know about Jesus?

This Beacon doesn't serve to question whether you have a relationship with Jesus. But it does want to challenge whether we are actively pursuing to grow in our relationship with God. Each person has their own stage of where they are with God. But no matter how deep or shallow your relationship with God is currently, we can always go deeper.

You might then ask, why is it necessary for us to pursue deeper intimacy with God? Why is it necessary to know more and deeper about Jesus? I think the answer is simple. Because Jesus pursued us first. Jesus first loved us and searched for us. 1 John 4:19 says: "We love because God first loved us."

To conclude, I whole heartedly believe, the more that as we pursue knowing Jesus at a deeper level the greater we will love Jesus and His people. The deeper we know Jesus the more our hearts will grow simply because the love of Christ is just that Good.
