THANKSGIVING

Hello all and Blessings! What an incredibly "quick" summer and fall we have had. We just wrapped up one of our great outreach opportunities, Trunk or Truck (which was wonderful!) and we have already begun our planning for Advent, the Christmas Cantata, Live Nativity and Christmas Eve service! Although there is much to do, I would invite you to pause with me for a moment and focus on Thanksgiving- a day that is often only sandwiched between Halloween and Christmas- well, that is at least how our culture views this very important holiday.

The Thanksgiving feast on which our current holiday is based took place just before the Pilgrims' second winter in Massachusetts. They had barely survived their first winter in 1620. More than half their company had died from starvation, disease, and exposure to the elements. However, with the help of the Wampanoag tribe of Native Americans, they had learned how to farm the land effectively, and their harvest in 1621 was abundant. In November of that year, they gathered to give thanks to God not just for the blessings that they had already received, but also for their faithful expectation that God would enable them to survive until the following spring. Thanksgiving is not just our response to the good things that have already happened, it is a way of life rooted in our conviction that everything, past, present, and future, is in the hands of a loving God who cares for us and blesses us in all the circumstances of our lives.

Paul, the author of Philippians, wrote to encourage Christians to "be thankful" in everything. If you read any of Paul's many letters, you might expect Paul and his followers to complain about the hazards of following Jesus; being a Christian. I am sure that it wasn't easy to endure the ridicule, abuse, and violence to which they were subjected daily. And yet, Paul refuses to even suggest that they complain. What Paul does instead, contrary to the expected sinful response, is advise the Philippian Christians to stop worrying and to put their trust in God who hears their prayers and responds to their needs. The proper response for a follower of Jesus is not anxiety and fear in the face of difficulties and dangers or uncertainties for the future, but thanksgiving rooted in faith that God has all things under control- which must become our way of life. Or, as Paul offers in his other letter to the church in Rome: "All things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to God's purpose."

So, as you gather with family and friends this Thanksgiving, my prayer is that the Holiday, often only sandwiched between candy and Christmas lights, becomes a day rooted in our conviction that everything, past, present, and future, is in the hands of a loving God who cares for us and blesses us in all the circumstances of our lives. May God bless you and all your loved ones with this spirit of faithful and hopeful thanksgiving! And may the peace of God that passes all understanding keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus!



Sinner Saved by Grace was written by Gloria and Bill Gaither. "George Younce the bass singer for the Cathedral Quartet asked Gloria and Bill Gaither to write a song about how he was a sinner saved by grace one night after a Cathedral concert. Gloria Gaither writes: He was from Mississippi, a country boy who lied about his age, left his Christian Home, and joined the paratroopers in 1947. In his own words, George recounts how he got in with the wrong crowd. He had a friend named Mousey Gonzalas that introduced him to the "left-handed cigarette" -marijuana. He worked for the HCO and the Officers

Club mixing drinks and singing country songs. His three months of special duty turned into three years of bartending and a longer struggle with alcohol. He rededicated his life to the Lord when he felt the Lord speaking to him and realized that there was no hope for him except in Jesus." (Gaither, 2015). It is somewhat interesting, two words of equal length but very different direction, meanings. I'm feeling the need to speak of both.

In western script you may have actually seen both spellings and you may have heard them after a fashion. One, "Oy", maybe the most recognizable, is defined as "woe". The meaning could be taken as "Woe is me." or "That's bad.", or maybe "That hurts." And, usually, it's not done in too significant a situation. Perhaps even lighthearted? There are escalations, but even then...

The second may possibly be even more familiar, at least its spelling. And pay no attention to the man behind the screen. The movie The Wizard Of Oz is iconic and seen on nearly every platform there is throughout the Fall holidays. But our pronouncing it as a kind of "ahz" is quite different from the Hebrew. There it has a long "o" and would sound more like "ohz". This word's defined as "strength", or "boldness". Quite a different path it seems.

Scripture says that we go from "strength unto strength". Dozens and dozens of references speak to us of Adonai being our strength and restoring us in it. He has directed us to follow His Word to a deeper relationship with Him, to depend on Him for that strength and to also raise us up and carry us forward in His holy name.

To be sure, though, we need to be aware that we cannot sit on our hands. God's calling requires a response. As He leads, we need to follow. As He moves and does, we need to do. Pray, read, study, look and listen. Take our hands and feet, our backs and brains, our souls and spirits and commit them to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Israel), and to our Messiah Jesus. Baruch Ha'shem. Blessed be the name.

The International Rescue Committee (IRC) is an international humanitarian aid nonprofit that works in crisis response, recovery, development, and advocacy. In the USA and United Kingdom, the IRC operates a network of resettlement field offices, helping individuals who have fled violence and conflict to build new lives in these countries.

IRC supports newly arrived clients through a variety of programs including case management, connecting them to employment, building financial literacy, enrolling children in schools, providing English language and cultural orientation classes, delivering enrichment and engagement programming to youth clients, assistance with immigration services, and more!

The federal government supplies basic supplies to them; however, these include sheet sets and bedspreads but no extra blankets for cold weather. We will be collecting blankets to help these people feel warm in their new environment. Please consider adding a **NEW** blanket, either Queen size or Twin size, to your shopping lists. This drive will run through **Sunday, November 26**. They may be dropped off any time in November in the box in the narthex. Thank you for thinking of others less fortunate.
