NEW LIFE

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he (or she) is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.

2 Corinthians 5:17 ESV

Hello all and blessings! By the time you read this month's Beacon you will have noticed, as have I, that the shelves in the local grocery stores and big box retailers are already filled with delicious, chocolate Easter eggs, and of course with my favorite, jellybeans. Easter bunnies, and their baskets filled with all kinds of good things, remind us that it is once again that wonderful time of year-Easter. Someone who knows that I am a pastor, but he does not identify as a Christian himself, recently asked me how the Easter bunny, eggs and chocolate all relate to what Christians celebrate as Easter. What a great question!

The Bible makes no mention of a long-eared, short-tailed creature who delivers decorated eggs to well-behaved children on Easter Sunday; nevertheless, the Easter bunny has become a prominent symbol of Christianity's most important holiday. To better understand how and why the rabbit became associated with Easter we must go back to ancient Mesopotamia and Syria. Three thousand years ago, the hare symbolized death and rebirth to these ancient people. Over time the associations made with hares shifted to rabbits because they have many of the same characteristics.

This association with death and rebirth may be why rabbits were depicted on gravestones in the Greco-Roman world. Early Christians appropriated the rabbit as a symbol on their gravestones as well. The "Easter" bunny first arrived in America in the 1700s with German immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania and transported their tradition of an egg-laying hare called "Osterhase" or "Oschter Haws" who delivered chocolates to well behaved children. As well, rabbits are known to be prolific procreators, are an ancient symbol of fertility and new life, and are commonly connected with the season of Spring. (Adapted from History.com)

In the end, the Easter bunny has nothing to do with Jesus directly and there is nothing in the Bible, or Christian tradition, that links the two together. As Christians, we understand the great significance of Easter: Easter is both an invitation to remember and great cause to celebrate. We remember the work of Jesus Christ on the cross (our

salvation) and we celebrate the reality of His resurrection (our hope and new life). Celebrating Easter is about rejoicing in the risen Christ! The cross, and death of Christ, is a proclamation that Christ has conquered sin and death and His resurrection proclaims his promise to resurrect each of us who believe, receive forgiveness, trust Him for our salvation, and follow Him!

As we look around us, we notice new life- everywhere there is new life. In every daffodil bloom, in every budding leaf or chirping robin, there is new life. Spring is the time when new life grows after the death brought about by winterjust as Jesus brings new life to those who were formerly dead in sin (Ephesians 2:1–10). The new life that Jesus brings is to be lived both today and eternally. We are to celebrate the reality of Christ's death and resurrection every day, and especially at Easter. We can trust Him and worship Him all year through because He was bruised and killed for our sake, buried for our sake, and He rose for our sake! Live your new life in Christ today- He is risen!

IN 2022, THROUGH FEBRUARY:

SoSA has gleaned, gathered, and distributed 2,452,360 pounds of fresh produce in 393 events, with 1,509 volunteers. Food donated by 109 farmers has been distributed to hungry people through 299 feeding agencies. That's a total of 7,357,080 servings of fresh food shared. Pounds of food already wasted in the U.S. this year: 32,451,204,577 This waste happens in the fields, transportation, supermarkets, restaurants, and homes.

MISSIONS

The Beulah Mission Team has been working to identify and support worthy missions locally, nationally, and in foreign lands. Our long-time friend and missionary in Chile, John Elmore, is retiring this spring, so we are looking at other Conference missions as well as continuing our financial support of two missions with close ties to Beulah: Len and Susan Eastwood with Neighbors Outreach Worldwide in Kenya, and the Coleman family with Konbit in Haiti. Locally, we are again collecting school supplies for our neighborhood elementary schools - Beulah, Hopkins, and Bensley, and thank you in advance for your generous donations. The Chesterfield Food Bank will add children's meals again during the summer months, and volunteers will be needed- we'll announce the dates ahead of time, and we're considering adding books for the kids to read while they're not in school. We are thankful to have a congregation that supports these missions and welcome any ideas you may offer.
