What is the first thing that comes to mind when you think of the bible or the phrase the Word of God? One of the things which makes a song so meaningful is the story of how the song was written and how it has journeyed through history. Each month we will be highlighting some of the songs we will be using in worship services.



<u>Victory in Jesus</u> was written by Eugene M. Bartlett, Sr. He was born in Missouri in 1885. He was a singer, songwriter, music producer, and a publisher. He married his sweetheart in 1917 and they had 2 children. He formed a publishing company with a few friends in 1918 called Hartford Music Company and his music was in much demand selling 15,000 copies across the country. In 1939, at age 53, tragedy struck. A paralyzing stroke left him bedridden, and unable to walk or speak. It was during this dark time that he wrote his best-known hymn, Victory in Jesus. He began to think back to the night that he was born again and to the rich life that he had since then. He realized that God had sustained him, and he felt prompted by the Holy Spirit to pen another verse..."I heard about his healing of his saving power redeeming, how he made the lame to walk again, and caused the blind to see. He realized that it was a story of redeeming power from the beginning to the end. He wanted the melody to be joyous and

full of enthusiasm. Though he was no longer able to minister or teach, his son Eugene Bartlett Jr took his ministry and his song around the country. One night, after preaching he gave an altar call. No one responded and he felt compelled to sing his father's song Victory in Jesus, immediately 50 people came. I Have Decided to Follow Jesus is a Christian hymn originating from India. 150 years ago, there was a great revival in Wales and many people became missionaries and went to India to spread the gospel in the Assam region which was full of head-hunters. A group of missionaries came from the American Baptist Mission, and they succeeded in converting a man named Nokseng, his wife, and their two children. Christianity began to spread, and the village chief became angry and told this family to renounce their faith or be killed. To which the man replied, "I have decided to follow Jesus". Immediately the chief ordered his archers to kill the man's children. "Renounce him!" the chief screamed at the man, or I'll kill your wife to which the man replied, "Though no one joins me, still I will follow. The chief ordered her execution also and he screamed at the man in fury to renounce and the man said, "The world behind me, the cross before me, no turning back." The chief ordered his execution and



then a miracle happened. The chief said, "Why would anyone want to die for a man that lived on another continent, 2000 years ago, I am moved by his faith, I want to taste his faith". He immediately shouted, "I too want to live for Jesus!" All the villagers also gave their hearts to Jesus. This song is based on the last words of Nokseng, a man from the Garo tribe of Assam.
