WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO SEEK GOD?

Now set your mind and heart to seek the Lord your God. (1 Chronicles 22:19)

This monthly newsletter, The Beacon, offers a great opportunity for me to share some insight beyond a Sunday morning sermon, insight into everyday stuff like, for example, our church's mission statement. Have you ever given much thought to our, Beulah church's, mission statement. Last month, in the January Beacon, we set out to understand our mission statement and to do so by breaking it down into digestible chunks. Perhaps it's important to refresh our memory, so here is our Mission Statement, "Transforming lives as we are Seeking, Sharing, and Serving God." Last month we talked about transformation. Transformation, the central task in our mission statement, isn't our task. Transformation takes place in our lives and the lives of those around us as we Seek, Share and Serve God. So, it is God's amazing work; the amazing work of God in us and through us to and for others! However, we believe, that Transformation only takes place as we Seek, Share and Serve God. So, what does it mean to do so; to seek God?

Seeking God means that we are seeking His (God's) presence. "Presence" is a common translation of the Hebrew word "face." Literally, we are to seek God's "face." We understand that God is omnipresent and therefore always near everything and everyone. God holds everything in being. God's power is ever-present in sustaining and governing all things. Therefore, God is always present with us his children. "Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).

This truth, God is always with us, is so comforting. But sometimes we fall into the trap of believing that, because God is always with us and we are His children, we do not need to seek Him. I want to remind us that God— the brightness of His personal character — is hidden from us because of our sin. That is why we are encouraged, throughout the whole of the Bible, to "seek the Lord . . . seek his presence continually" (Psalm 105:4).

But what does that mean practically? Both the Old and New Testaments say it is a "setting of the mind and heart" on God. It is the conscious fixing or focusing of our mind's attention and our heart's affection on God. Paul, writing to the church of Colossae, writes, "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth." (Colossians 3:1–2)

So, seeking God must be a conscious choice; we must direct our hearts, minds and attention toward God. This is what Paul prays for the church: "May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ" (2 Thessalonians 3:5).

As we Seek God, we will find that we are transformed! We are transformed to bring a static mission statement to life 2) To live as those who have a "KINGDOM" impact on otherswhere they too are encouraged to SEEK God and be Transformed!

MUSIC NOTES

The hymn that I have selected to share with you, is one of my favorites. "How Firm a Foundation"

How Firm a Foundation-the author is unknown. A well-known minister from England, John Rippon published it in 1787 in A Selection of Hymns from the Best Authors under the first line of How firm a foundation, ye saints of the Lord. This collection contained a variety of hymns that he thought were powerful. In 1832 a hymn tune was paired with How firm a foundation, ye saints of the Lord called Protection and then later changed to Foundation. This collection of hymns was published and released eleven times before his death in 1836. One edition made its way to America to the Baptist Churches there in Philadelphia.

This hymn was beloved by Andrew Jackson, who requested that it be sung while he was dying. During the Civil War, both sides were documented while singing it.

Others like Robert E. Lee and Theodore Roosevelt requested that it be sung at their funerals.

In December 24, 1898, during the Spanish-American War, Lieutenant-Colonel Curtis Guild Jr recalls that a sentinel's voice rang out "Number ten, twelve o'clock and all is well, before the call died away, a baritone's voice began singing How Firm a Foundation, ye saints of the Lord, another voice joined in, then another until the

whole regiment was singing. The Sixth Missouri joined in then the Fourth Virginia until all along the ridges over the great city were singing."



Okay, most of us have heard the phrase "To make God laugh, tell Him your plans." Before last week I certainly had no thought or intention of moving in this direction. Valentine's had me in the ER with a whole bunch of abdominal pain and no real idea what it was from. A day-plus and three hallways later I was finally placed in a room and began to get some real answers.

The gut (ongoing for now) seems to be "non-obstructive diverticulitis". Sitting up straight can be difficult at best, with the most comfortable position as somewhat flat on my back. Try eating like this, or drinking. I lost almost twenty pounds in less than a week. This did not necessarily help what kept me in the hospital. And now we get to the heart of the matter.

Because of going to the ER, blood cultures were drawn that revealed a staph infection, unrelated to the diverticulitis. Something I didn't know was that staph can attach itself to heart valves. If unchecked, it can and will cause major problems. The hospital started antibiotics, which will continue at home through a "pickline" for two weeks.

Philippians 4:4 tells us "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, rejoice." It's kind-of hard to rejoice in what I was feeling in my abdomen, but when they found something and began treating early that which could potentially kill you, you become very grateful for the pain. You rejoice. You give thanks.

It is my understanding that one of the reasons God chose the Hebrews was that they are a people of thanksgiving. The Hebrew word for rejoice is "simkhah" (seem kah). The word for thanksgiving is "hodayah". The word for thanks is "todah" Shalom.

At Cunningham Children's Home, we often see God work in ways we don't expect. In 2020, when we started our Runaway and Homeless Youth (RHY) program, we experienced one of those God moments. RHY provides emergency and temporary shelter for individuals facing homelessness. When we were setting up a transitional living house for RHY participants, Angie, our associate director of Community Services, envisioned a safe refuge that would also provide peace and comfort. With help from her team, everything came together. The ranch-style home has four bedrooms, a comfortable living room and a bright kitchen. A fresh coat of paint with warm colors added to the welcoming environment for those enduring chaos and uncertainty. The house also had a wheelchair ramp from the driveway to the front door. "A wheelchair ramp?" Angie questioned. "Well, we don't really have a need for that but maybe it will be nice to have." On the very day RHY started offering services, we received a referral for Jamona and her son, who were about to lose their home with nowhere to go. Jamona, paralyzed from the waist down, requires a wheelchair! God certainly knew what we needed before we did.
