TRANSFORMATION

And we all, with unveiled faces, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit. (2 Cor. 3:18, ESV)

Hello! I recently took a fresh look at our church's mission statement; "Transforming lives as we Seek, Share, and Serve God." Our mission statement is present in various places around the church including the bulletin used each Sunday morning for worship. However, like most things that we see daily or even weekly, we soon become unaware of their presence, and "they" lose their significance in our daily lives. Our church mission statement invites us to know that we have a purpose and a goal. Our mission statement invites us to recognize the work of God in our lives and to understand that God's work in our lives is invitational - we share it with others!

Transforming lives, this is the action statement used to begin our mission statement.

Transforming can be defined and understood as: a thorough or dramatic change in the form, appearance, or character of. (Oxford Dictionary). This definition reminds me of one of my favorite childhood television programs - The Incredible Hulk. Bruce Banner, a scientist who uses an

experimental medical treatment on himself, transforms into a huge, green, raging monster when he becomes angry. Now, I understand the Hulk to be a fictional character, however I think it truly represents a transformation that is common in each of us when we operate from our human condition - our sin.

Paul in his letter to the church at Corinth, reminds us that our life in Christ is transformational at its core. Meaning, when we choose Christ as our Lord and Savior, accepting His sacrificial death and resurrection as our atoning work (our forgiveness), the transformation begins.

This transformation has a beginning (something we are transformed from), an end (something we are transformed into), and there are changes that continue to happen in between. Theologians call this change "sanctification," a word we have either forgotten or misunderstood in our culture.

The hymn that I have chosen to share the history of for the February 2024 Beacon is Take My Life and Let It Be.

Take My Life and Let It Be - was written by Frances Havergal. She was born into an Anglican family in Worcestershire, England. Her father was a clergyman and hymn writer. At the age of four, she began reading and eventually memorized the Psalms, Isaiah, and parts of the New Testament. She began writing poetry at the age of seven. When her poetry had matured a little, she composed "Like a River Glorious", "I Gave My Life for Thee", and "Who Is On the Lord's Side?".

TAKE MY LIFE AND LET IT BE

- 1. Take my life and let it be
 Consecrated Lord to thee
 Take my moments and my days
 Let it flow in endless praise
 Take my hands and let them move
 At the impulse of thy love

She studied in Louisenschule, Dusseldorf, and Oberkassel. Frances was a brilliant pianist and was in demand as a concert vocal soloist. She learned several languages plus Greek and Hebrew. Despite her high education, Francis had a childlike faith and confidence in God. Everywhere she traveled she told others about him.

Take My Life was written when Frances went on a journey of five days to a house that had ten people in it. She writes that "some were converted but not happy believers and some were not believers at all though she had been praying for them a long time. Once she arrived there, she said to the Lord, "Lord, give me all that are in this house." She writes that the Lord answered her prayer. Everyone in the house received a blessing. She was so happy on the last night that she couldn't sleep and the verses that we know and love, came one by one, so she wrote them down".

Makhaneh Emunim/Nohag... Training Camp/Practice

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION IRA

RMDs (Required Minimum Distributions). If you are required to take RMDs, you can gift up to \$100,000 to Beulah (\$200,000 if a couple), but you have to follow certain rules --- you do not receive the money; instead, the custodian sends the check directly to the charity (Beulah) --- be certain the Payee is Beulah Church (not Beulah United Methodist Church) and the mailing address is PO Box 37098, N. Chesterfield, VA 23234. This method will avoid taxes if payable to Beulah. See IRS Publication 590-B or visit IRS.gov for more information regarding IRA distributions.

Some of our members have elected to have RMDs sent to Beulah monthly, bi-monthly, quarterly, or semi-annually rather than only once a year. We really appreciate this since we have many monthly bills to pay such as utilities, payroll, building maintenance, worship supplies, etc. If you have any questions, see any member of the Finance Committee.
